## CALL FOR PAPERS

ERGONOMICS CHALLENGES  
FOR SAFETY AND HEALTHY  
ORGANIZATION OF WORK

### BACKGROUND REASONS

1. Based on long experiences working in Ergonomics (Erg), Occupational Safety and Health (OSH), it seems that we are practically ***still running at the same place*** up to now. Accident in fact is still happening, even also in a workplace fully equipped with up to date regulation and acts as well as safety measures likes personal protective devices. Priority must be given to tackle and manage ***unsafe behavior*** and developing ***safety behavior with its positive thinking and act. Mind set*** changes become an important issue to be successful. And a total ***approach*** must be done to solve the problem completely.
2. In spite of recent advances in applying ergonomics knowledge and experience in occupational safety and health management systems, prevention of accidents and health interventions, due to limitation in various means, there ***are remain huge gaps in the research and application of ergonomics AND osh in the real work.***
3. Meanwhile in doing research, it seems that the same actions and a recall of what we have been done previously, colored ones research steps. By doing so, the problems basically have not been solved wholly and sustained. A waste of time and cost, beside a short of euphoria especially by the respected researchers. ***In Fact, we are busy doing the same thing as repeaters, only with different people and different method as well as technology.*** No advances in respect to the problems solution as a whole. Just likes working on the top of mountain only, and leaving at large the problems root cause.
4. It seems that a very limited horizon owned by the researcher is the root cause of the matters. ***A widen horizon and conduct of future management with new mind set is really needed to start and anticipate the changes in solving the problems.*** Otherwise we shall be walking or running always at the same place.
5. The community at large and the industrial community in particular would like to have ***the real and beneficial improvements*** which are meeting also the globalization demands, which should ***have a humane, competitive and sustainable work system and product.***

  - a. Paper size : A4 – format
  - b. Full type area used : 160 mm x 215 mm
  - c. Typeface : font Times New Roman, size 10, single line spacing.
  - d. Title : 14 point, with initial capital for first word, centred, correct placing.
  - e. Authors names : 12 point, initial capitals, centred, correct placing.
  - f. Affiliations : 10 point italic, initials capital, centred, referenced by superscript letter, correct placing.
  - g. Abstract : approaximately 75 – 200 words, indent first line, correct placing.
  - h. Keywords : 9 point italic, maximum 6 keywords, comma separated.
  - i. Text : 1 column format, maximum 6 pages.
  - j. Main headings : initial capital for first word, bold type, 2 blank lines above, 1 below.
  - k. Secondary headings : initial capital for first word, italic type, 1 blank above and below.
  - l. Tertiary headings : initial capital for first word, italic; 1 blank line above, none below.
  - m. Paragraphs : indent the first line of each, including after a new section heading; no space between paragraphs.
  - n. Figures : acceptable line quality, ligible text, inserted approximately in text; figure caption below figures.
  - o. Tables : heading above table.
  - p. References : Harvard system
